Syllabus for FOGSI- ICOG Certificate Course in

Fetal Medicine

OBJECTIVE

This is a six month certification programme geared towards development of an obstetrician with expertise in Fetal medicine as sub - specialty.

Training is focused on tertiary level of care for the pregnant women and the fetus, which involves comprehensive, investigative workup of abnormalities as well as appropriate management of confirmed abnormal cases.

a. Faculty will act as teachers, facilitators and expert authorities

b. Self-directed efforts at learning and research data compilation is encouraged

c. Hands-on training and patient management under supervision is provided

d. Internet access, CDs, video - clips, full fledged library, class room teaching, interactive sessions, journal clubs and case presentations as per pre - fixed schedules.

To learn essentials of genetics

- a) Chromosomal abnormalities

- c) Common prenatal genetic tests available

Expectations from the candidate

The role of the Fetal Medicine candidate would be:

- to be regular in attendance, sincere in learning and maintain a generally courteous demeanour in clinics.

- To perform ancillary procedures required and in the management of complicated clinical cases,

- To propose her/his own plan of management and be able justify it while discussing evidence -based options.

- To gather evidence-based data in favor of or against the various options in management

- To monitor the progress of cases as her own, sharing her observations and plans with the attending staff

- Regular classes will be held within the centre and also centrally – the students must attend at least 80% of these classes.

- Training - to fully comprehend the essential and fundamental principles relating to practice.

- Research - to submit atleast one scientific paper for publications

Assessment for certification

Internal assessment

This will be based on the evaluation of the Log book- It is therefore recommended that each candidate should maintain a proper record of events of teaching and experiences , preferably in a sequentially dated manner in a log book.. The record will include academic activities as well as the presentations and procedures carried out by the candidate.

The written assessment:

There shall be a written assessment at the end of 6months. Theory paper shall carry 100 marks.

Practical Exam:

There shall be one or two external examiners, appointed by the ICOG ~ FOGSI. 1 hour maximum 100 marks

Certification:

Based on the recommendations made by the examiners, successful candidate would be awarded the Certificate scroll by ICOG ~ FOGSI.

In case of unsatisfactory completion, the trainee would be given another chance to appear before the examiners (6 months) later.
